# VMCCA Membership Dues Increase for 2024

## VMCCA Annual Dues will increase to \$48

As in most areas since COVID, costs of business for our club are going up. It has become necessary to raise annual dues to \$48 for Active Members. Student Memberships will remain \$12 and Junior Memberships will remain \$5 a year. Life Memberships are still \$600.

VMCCA President Duane Copley said, "As some of you may now be aware, the annual dues for our club have been raised from \$40 annually to \$48. As some of you may not be aware, our club has been running a deficit budget for the last several years. This was discussed at some length during the first quarter 2023 meeting held in Reno where the increase in dues was approved." (For further details, see our President's Message in the May/June <u>Bulb Horn</u>.)

Full-year dues collected after September 1 of each year cover the rest of the current calendar year and all of the coming year. In other words, if you pay \$48 dues any time after September 1, 2023, you are considered fully paid as an Active Member through all of 2024.

Thank you for understanding the need to improve revenues, to keep our club and publications going strong. When you send in your 2024 membership renewal, please be sure to send the new amount, \$48.

The Vintage Motor Car Club of America has not held a National tour in the state of Arkansas since 1963. While change has happened everywhere across America, Arkansas's natural beauty, small towns, and scenic country roads are abundant and uncrowded. You are invited to join your friends and meet new friends on a tour where you will always be close to something special.

Clarksville has been chosen as our host city, Holiday Inn and Suites, our host hotel. Daily tours will take us into the Northwest section of the state. This area of Arkansas has scenic routes in every direction. We limited our planning to a few routes within reasonable daily tour distances. Taking distance into consideration, it is fair to say that this is truly a driving tour. Most routes are loops, so we won't travel or back track on roads we have already travelled. There are planned destinations with many enjoyable views and stops along the way.

FORT SMITH – VANBUREN - Interstate 40 is designated as a scenic route. The drive is along parallel backroads that are more scenic and less crowded with tourists. Venues include the U. S. Marshall's Museum Immersive Exhibit and Fort Smith Historical Site.

MT. MAGAZINE SCENIC BYWAY AND STATE PARK – Spectacular views of Mt. Magazine in the distance and panoramic vistas of the surrounding hills and valleys. A visit to Wiederkehr Winery and Wine Cellar ends the drive.

HARRISON - The route to Harrison goes through the Ozark National Forest and the Boston and Ozark Mountains on a designated scenic route. It is a long drive with many scenic stop opportunities and quaint towns. The return route to Clarksville goes further into the National Forests on less traveled roads

PIG TRAIL HIGHWAY – FAYETTEVILLE - We'll travel a scenic route through the western side of the Boston and Ozark Mountains to Fayetteville. The venues include Botanical Gardens of the Ozarks, Drake Airfield and Prairie Grove Battlefield.

PETIT JEAN STATE PARK - A shorter drive, this route takes us along the scenic Dardanelle Lake (part of the Arkansas River Navigation system) to the State Park and the Museum of Automobiles.

Most days will include a light lunch. Opening and Closing Banquets will be held at a banquet facility in Clarksville.

This tour will be limited to twenty five (25) vehicles and the registration form will be on the VMCCA website later or by contacting the director - Steve Fitzgerald by email at: <u>studebakersteve@bresnan.net</u> or calling (970) 209 7814 with your questions.

We will leave from Grand Junction where Part I ended. By a vote of the participants in Part I, we shall travel over the same route taken in 1776 by padres Francisco Dominguez and Silvestre Velez de Escalante. We shall go over the beautiful Douglas pass and then through Canyon Pintado with its many ancient petroglyphs and pictographs. We will then stop for a catered lunch at the Bud Striegel car collection museum in Rangely on our way to Dinosaur National Monument before stopping for the night in Vernal, Utah. We then proceed on through Utah on back roads and near Utah Lake where the fathers finally found the bearded Spaniards as part of their mission. With many hardships but with the help of Ute natives, they continued south where weather and a lack of supplies caused them to give up their quest to get to the new mission at Monterrey among the Californios. We will travel through Parowan Gap with its hundreds of historical petroglyphs from several generations. We will also see dinosaur tracks before we arrive in Cedar City and then on to St. George by way of Kolob Canyon, a part of Zion National Park.

There will be many amazing sites and sights as well as some great lunch stops along the way. As I drove this route in July, I saw many pronghorns, deer and wild horses - mustangs of the non Ford variety. We end this segment in St. George with its many options of things to see and do before and after our closing banquet. For those who left trailers in Grand Junction, there will be an escorted trip back to Grand Junction with our trouble truck and trailer taking a different beautiful route on one of the eight Old Spanish Trails.

Part III will go from St. George to Santa Fe November 17 - 23, 2024 following the padres' route. There will be a special Part IV tour from Cedar City, Utah to Monterrey, California from May 4 -10 in 2025. It will follow back roads that I had not been on since my days on a Vespa in the sixties. It will cross Death Valley at a better time of year than July 19 when it hit 131 degrees after I crossed in the morning. The fathers had no way to determine longitude and the natives told them they could get to the big water in a week. That would not have happened. I was asked "What if?" so....here it is. To Monterrey and back with no freeways.

## Tom Hale: A Gifted and Talented Automotive Artist

I had the pleasure of meeting Tom Hale when I worked at the Walter P. Chrysler Museum many years ago. I was very impressed with his automotive illustrations that highlighted the history of the automobile with great colors and a beautiful contrast of tints. Tom's illustrations are recognized by many automotive enthusiasts from all over the world. Tom is not just a gifted automotive illustrator and a fantastic artist; he is also a perfect gentleman with a great personality, which many people have come to admire.

Hale's journey began at the age of seven when he started drawing futuristic automobile designs. When he entered high school, his passion for drawing automobiles continued. Hale graduated from high school in 1958, and he started his career in the U. S. Navy serving aboard a destroyer for two years.

After completing his naval service in 1963, Hale enrolled at the Art Center College of Design in Los Angeles to further explore his education. His time at Art Center College of Design created a path to becoming a talented automotive designer. He has said that his enthusiasm for art and automobiles carried him through his college days. In 1966, Hale graduated with a degree in transportation design.

#### Thanks Joe and Cindy for a great tour!



It all started with my husband, Joe, talking to Greg Rising at the Rhinory Tour about Morris Ranch, a "ghost town" that's not too far from our house. It ended with us planning our first tour for the car club.

For those who don't know, Morris Ranch originated in 1856 when a man from New York named Francis Morris bought 23,000 acres southwest of Fredericksburg for just 25 cents per acre. His son later turned the property into a center for breeding thoroughbred racehorses, spending over \$500,000 on

barns, a hotel, houses, warehouses, a school, a cotton gin, a general store, a flour mill, and a racetrack. In 1902, the horses were sold and the property was subdivided into tenant cotton farms. The general store and school are still standing, both now privately owned.

Joe and Greg decided that we would meet at Backwoods BBQ before the tour and end up back there for lunch after the tour. But it was the in-between we had fun figuring out. We knew we wanted to take the tour by the still-standing buildings off Morris Ranch Road, but where to from there? Over the course of a few days, we explored backroads we had not been on yet. Keeping track of the incremental mileage and creating the printed itinerary was my job.

If you haven't planned a tour yet, I would encourage you to do so. Our initial planning was done in our truck, but we drove the day of the tour in Joe's Sunbeam Tiger with the top down. It gave us a whole different perspective of the roads.
