Announcements

VMCCA VETERANS AND GOLD STAR FAMILY MEMBERS

On Veterans Day 2022, the National Park Service unveiled a lifetime pass providing free entrance to **national parks** for Veterans and

their families. The Interagency Military Lifetime Pass waives entrance fees for the National Park Service and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and standard amenity recreation fees for the Bureau of Land Management, Bureau of Reclamation, U.S. Forest Service and U.S. Army Corps of Engineers sites for current military service members and their dependents, Veterans and Gold Star Families. These passes will provide Veterans and their families with free access to approximately 2,000 public locations spread out across more than 400 million acres of public lands, which host activities to fit any lifestyle—from serene to high octane, including hiking, fishing, paddling, biking, hunting, stargazing, camping, and much more.

The Military Pass has been expanded to include a pass that does not expire for Veterans and Gold Star Family members. The National Defense Authorization Act of 2022 authorized a free lifetime pass to national parks and other federal recreational lands for eligible Veterans and Gold Star Families.

Are you eligible?

For purposes of this program, a Veteran is identified as an individual who has served in the United States Armed Forces, including the National Guard and Reserve, and is able to present one of the following forms of valid (unexpired) identification:

- Department of Defense Identification Card
- Veteran Health Identification Card (VHIC)
- Veteran ID Card
- Veterans designation on a state-issued U.S. driver's license or identification card

Gold Star Families are next of kin of a member of the United States Armed Forces who lost his or her life in a "qualifying situation," such as a war, an international terrorist attack, or a military operation outside of the United States while serving with the United States Armed Forces.

If you are an avid antique car tourer or just a person or family who like to camp and hike in our nations many parks, this may be just what you need.

These passes may be obtained at any National Park where they charge a fee. If you are looking for the nearest park to you that offers these passes "over the Counter" go to

https://www.nps.gov/orgs/1207/11-8-2022-lifetime-pass.htm. Scroll down 7 paragraphs and there is a place you can click and find these parks near you.

If there is nothing available within a simple commute, you may also purchase a "kit" for \$10 and it will be mailed to your home. When doing this you will need to fill out the forms. The primary thing you may have to dig out of your papers is the exact date you were terminated from Service. Do not give the date you separated from active duty. They want the date you completed your 6-year obligation to the Armed Forces. This "kit" can be purchased at https://store.usgs.gov/MilitaryPass.

You will need to create an account but they do take all credit cards. I used this method after I determined it was easier and cheaper to get

my pass this way than driving 40 miles to a park.

Every Veteran is special but VMCCA members who are veterans or active duty or reserve members of our armed forces are extra special and deserve our recognition.

The Old Spanish Trail Part II May 12 through May 18, 2024 Grand Junction, Colorado to St. George, Utah.





This tour will be limited to twenty five (25) vehicles and the registration form will be on the VMCCA website later or by contacting the director - Steve Fitzgerald by email at: studebakersteve@bresnan.net or calling (970) 209 7814 with your questions.

We will leave from Grand Junction where Part I ended. By a vote of the participants in Part I, we shall travel over the same route taken in 1776 by padres Francisco Dominguez and Silvestre Velez de Escalante. We shall go over the beautiful Douglas pass and then through Canyon Pintado with its many ancient petroglyphs and pictographs. We will then stop for a catered lunch at the Bud Striegel car collection museum in Rangely on our way to Dinosaur National Monument before stopping for the night in Vernal, Utah. We then proceed on through Utah on back roads and near Utah Lake where the fathers finally found the bearded Spaniards as part of their mission. With many hardships but with the help of Ute natives, they continued south where weather and a lack of supplies caused them to give up their quest to get to the new mission at Monterrey among the Californios. We will travel through Parowan Gap with its hundreds of historical petroglyphs from several generations. We will also see dinosaur tracks before we arrive in Cedar City and then on to St. George by way of Kolob Canyon, a part of Zion National Park.

There will be many amazing sites and sights as well as some great lunch stops along the way. As I drove this route in July, I saw many pronghorns, deer and wild horses - mustangs of the non Ford variety. We end this segment in St. George with its many options of things to see and do before and after our closing banquet. For those who left trailers in Grand Junction, there will be an escorted trip back to Grand Junction with our trouble truck and trailer taking a different beautiful route on one of the eight Old Spanish Trails.

Part III will go from St. George to Santa Fe November 17 - 23, 2024 following the padres' route. There will be a special Part IV tour from Cedar City, Utah to Monterrey, California from May 4 -10 in 2025. It will follow back roads that I had not been on since my days on a Vespa in the sixties. It will cross Death Valley at a better time of year than July 19 when it hit 131 degrees after I crossed in the morning. The fathers had no way to determine longitude and the natives told them they could get to the big water in a week. That would not have happened. I was asked "What if?" so....here it is. To Monterrey and back with no freeways.







The XNR was a Great-Looking Plymouth Concept Car



The XNR was a great looking show car that was introduced by the Chrysler Corporation on March 1, 1960. The name XNR was derived from the name of Virgil Exner, who was Chrysler's design chief. The XNR was designed on a Plymouth Valiant chassis. The theme of the styling was called asymmetrical, having the upper design feature off-center and in line with the driver. The concept model offered seating space for both the driver and a passenger. It had a 106.5-inch wheelbase and a 46-inch overall height. It was also powered by a Valiant slant six-horsepower engine. The model was produced in Italian Red and the body was carefully hand built. Each detail of the XNR concept model had its own distinction which most people thoroughly enjoyed, and it was a great sensation on the Auto Show circuit around the country.

Sounds of the 1960s: Remembering Great Car Music

The great music and the sensational singing groups of the 1960s remain as some of the most memorable moments in our American culture. These tunes often highlighted popular hot rods and the car culture during that time period. Our society has always been fascinated with music and cars. Today, when I attend many car shows, you still can hear great songs from groups like the Beach Boys. You might even groove to the famous Rip Chords and their

popular song "Hey Little Cobra," which was one of the highest ranking hot rod songs of all time.

Perhaps one of the most overlooked chapters in our American culture was the role music played in influencing American style by way of the automobile. The 1960s were an integral part of our history birthing great muscle cars and hot rods. These fast, powerful, and competitive cars were most often described in the lyrics of singing groups. Drag races, which were sometimes dangerous, became very popular among young adults during this time period. Drag races demonstrated a vehicle's speed, power and endurance.

President's Corner






