VMCCA Dues to Increase



VMCCA Dues to Become \$58 (\$50, digital Bulb Horn) for 2026

Despite the 2024 dues increase, VMCCA operating expenses required a deficit budget in 2025, and another for 2026. Inflation continues. As with so many organizations in this electronic age, membership is shrinking so dues income is down. Tour income year to year is undependable.

Club officers and the Board of Governors have been working hard to cut costs without sacrificing the quality of publications or tours. To keep the VMCCA operating, it has become necessary to generate reliable income that keeps pace with inflation. The Treasurer will cover more on the new dues plan in future columns. Main points for the coming year, 2026:

- Dues for regular membership will increase to \$58.
- Digital Bulb Horn membership will increase to \$50.
- Mid-year NEW Member and Swap Meet Special dues will be \$30.

Communication with the National organization energizes local participation. It lets members see the benefits their membership provides. People all over the country share plans and ideas.



Chrysler Had Great Success with Their Muscle Car Advertising

One of the most influential automotive advertising campaigns from the 1960s and 1970s was introduced by the Chrysler Corporation. For many years, auto enthusiasts have spoken about or collected Chrysler muscle car advertising material.

1960s and 1970s culture had a great influence on the young people of that era. There was both wonderful music along and great-looking automotive designs. The cars were fast and offered psychedelic colors.

In addition, the early 1960s was the dawn of the muscle car craze. The Plymouth Road-Runner, taken from the Warner Brothers fast cartoon bird with a "Beep-Beep" voice, became an American muscle car icon. The famous cartoon bird that inspired the car's horn became a great success among younger drivers.

The two men who spearheaded the relationship between Plymouth and the Road-Runner cartoon bird were Gordon Cherry, who came up with the idea of using the Warner Brothers character for the car, and Jack Smith, who secured the rights to use the character from Warner Brothers for \$50,000. Another \$10,000 was invested to create the iconic car horn that goes "Beep Beep.





The year was 1956 and, if you were a teenager at the time or a young adult, you were probably listening to Elvis Presley or perhaps watching "Father Knows Best" on your black and white television. In 1956, General Motors was riding high with strong sales, maintaining its status as the largest automaker in the world.

1956 was also a good year for GM employees with more people working and making a great living. A stock purchase program was made available to salaried employees in the United States to enable them to increase their stake in GM's progress. Alfred P, Sloan Jr., was Chairman of the Board, and Harlow H. Curtice


was the President of GM in 1956.







From some people's perspectives, cars provide pure utility. They can get you from Point A to Point B. For others, classic cars provide entertainment or recreation as a nice weekend hobby.


In the case of Gilmore Garage Works, cars can provide invaluable life lessons.
